If the cumulative number of hardshell sea turtle takes by the bottom longline fishery exceeds or is predicted to exceed 80% of the anticipated takes specified in the incidental take statement (ITS) in the most recent biological opinion, commercial reef fish longlining activities in the Gulf of Mexico within 50 fathoms would cease for the remainder of the fishing year. Because the number of anticipated takes specified in the ITS in the biological opinion spans a three-year period, the threshold for closing the fishery would be 80% of 1/3 of the biological opinion's anticipated takes during the first year (2010), 80% of 2/3 of biological opinion's anticipated takes for the first and second years (2010-2011), and 80% of the biological opinion's anticipated takes for the first three years (2010-2012) and thereafter.

Substitute Motion: To require commercial reef fish longline vessels to carry observers to document sea turtle takes at a scientifically adequate level to be determined by the SEFSC.

Second Substitute Motion: To move Action 4 to considered but rejected.
