



Roy Crabtree, regional administrator of NOAA Fisheries Service Southeast Regional Office since January 2003, began his career as a self-employed fishing guide in the Florida Keys and Everglades National Park. He was later employed as a senior research scientist at Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Fish and Wildlife Research Institute, and as the director of the

Commission's Division of Marine Fisheries.
