

Dr. Steve Jacob is an Associate Professor of Sociology at York College of Pennsylvania. He completed his Masters and Ph.D. degrees at Penn State University in Rural Sociology. Prior to his appointment at York college of Pennsylvania he was an Assistant Professor of Community Development at the University of Florida. Dr. Jacob is a Fellow at the Houston Advanced Research Center and an elected Fellow of the Society for Applied Anthropology. He is a Senior Associate at the Institute of Applied Social Research. Since 2008 he is an appointed member of the Gulf of Mexico Fishery Management Council Socioeconomic Panel.

His research interests are in understanding community structures, societal impacts on natural resources, program development and evaluation, social indicators, and fishing communities. Recent research endeavors have focused on determining the social and economic impacts of regulatory changes, primarily among fishers and fish-reliant communities in the Gulf of Mexico. His recent publications have appeared in the Journal *Fisheries*, *Marine Policy*, *Human Organization*, and *Social Indicators Research*.
